- 1. Jesus "would withdraw to deserted places and pray." (Luke 5:16)
- 2. "He spent the night in prayer to God." (Luke 6:12)
- 3. "Jesus took with him Peter and John and James, and went up on the mountain to pray.(Luke 9:28)
- 4. "He was praying in a certain place." (Luke 11:1)


Thus we read the depth of Jesus' prayer life. When we meditate upon this, we would realize that Jesus not only prayed at specific moments or during emergency meetings, but we'd be enlightened on the truth that from the very beginning of His life to the very end, He prayed and that His life was solely rooted in prayer.

When He assumed the human form-In His infancy and childhood-In His public life-When in solitude and with His apostles-When He hung on the Cross-When He sat the right hand of the Father in all His glory-

The people of the world were immersed in their sinful ways of living. All forms of sacrifices to appease God in atonement for their sins were of no avail. The world was thus groaning in agony. The Almighty and Triune God considered this hapless state and pitied the human kind. Thus the Son of God who was in close embrace of the Father deigned to descend on the earth and sought to do the Father's will. (Hebrews 10:7)

He assured the Father that He would fulfill His wish in the human form that that He had assumed, by being a sacrificial offering Himself as an atonement for the sins of the world, as all other offerings did not seem pure in the sight of the Father. (Hebrews 10:5-9)

The letter to the Hebrews thus reflects on this longing that Jesus exuded all His life to fulfill the will of the Father which was the foundation of His action-plan for His Ministry on the earth. The letter to the Ephesians too briefly states the idea. St. Paul praises God who pours out His heavenly Blessings of the Holy Spirit through Jesus.

He thanks God for pre-conceiving the idea of our holiness and immaculate nature, by moulding us through Jesus. (Ephesians 1:3-4) Yes, the Father pre-destined our life in Jesus even before the world was born. It was in fulfillment of this plan that Jesus took on the form of a man.

"He has made known to us the mystery of his will, according to his good pleasure that he set forth in Christ, as a plan for the fullness of time, to gather up all things in him, things in heaven and things on earth." (Ephesians 1:10)

When He assumed the human form

God the Father sought the approval of a woman, for His Son to be born in this world. In the beginning of creation God created man out of the dust of the earth. (Genesis 2:7) He breathed life into his nostrils He formed a woman from one of his rib bones. (Genesis 2: 21-22) But He did not form the human flesh for His Son from out of the dust of the earth. The Gospel of Luke brings to light the approval sought by the Father from the young virgin of Nazareth, by sending His angel Gabriel who explained the Father's heart-felt wish. (Luke 1:26-38) Just as the Son was more than ready to fulfill the will of the Father, so too was the virgin of Nazareth ever ready to do His will. She expressed Her willingness saying, "Behold the handmaid of the Lord, be it done to me according to His Word." (Luke 1:38)The humility and the Faith of the of Mary paved the way for the Divine Word to take 'flesh' and be born in the world. Thus was the prayer of the Son of God fulfilled. From thence flowed the prayer of the Son of God and of Mary in total harmony with the other. It then led to the crushing of the head of the wily 'serpent' that harmed humanity. The promise of God was thus fulfilled.

"I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and hers; he will strike your head, and you will strike his heel." (Genesis 3:15).

We witness the fervent prayer life of Jesus coupled with His Mother's, being a well spring for the Redemption of mankind. Thus the conception of the Divine Word in Her womb, led to the overflowing of joy and prosperity wherever the virgin Mother paid a visit! Bearing the child who is the Eternal Word, The Mother Went to the hilly town of Judea to meet her cousin Elizabeth.

She greeted them on reaching: "When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the child leaped in her womb. And Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit." (Luke 1:41) This was indeed an unusual happening, a mystery. This reveals the indelible truth that in union with the Virgin Mother, the Son of God Jesus, poured out His Holy Spirit, opening up the fountain of Redemption.



Elizabeth was thus empowered to comprehend the presence of the Redeemer and to exclaim in praise, "The Mother of my Lord". And this filled her heart with great joy. She revealed that her child leapt in her womb, on hearing the greeting of the Blessed Mother. (Luke 1:44) This is not a joy that the world can offer. This is the heavenly joy that erupts on being filled with the Holy Spirit, the joy that envelops us on being redeemed by God.

Thus the world accepted the Mother who carried the Divine Word. The Holy Spirit thus spoke through the mouth of Elizabeth: "And blessed is she who believed that there would be a fulfillment of what was spoken to her by the Lord." (Luke 1:45) The Faith of the virgin Mother and the Fruit of Her womb were essential for the Redemption of the world.
